Donald Kingsley Ault, 86, of Bowling Green, Kentucky, passed away January 27, 2007. He was born in Cardinal, Ontario, Canada, the son of Byron R. and Alice I. Ault. He received his education in Ontario schools, and attended Annesly College in Ottawa, Canada. Later he received his Th. B. degree from Indiana Wesleyan University, Owosso, Michigan branch.

He served as pastor at Skanateles, New York and Wiraton, Ontario, Canada. He came to the United States as a permanent resident in 1942 and served as the founding pastor of the Wesleyan Church in Oxford, New York.

He married Elizabeth (Betty) M. Snow in 1943. Following the completion of his education at Owosso, MI, he and Mrs. Ault were appointed as missionaries with Wesleyan World Missions to Zambia, Africa in 1945 where they served for three years. Upon returning to the United States they pastored in Middletown and Goshen, Indiana for the Church of the Nazarene. They accepted a Missionary appointment to Guyana, South America and served there from 1952 to 1957. They served as the founding pastors for the Church of the Nazarene at Vandalia, Ohio. Other pastoral assignments include Yorktown and Marion, IN, Columbus, Ohio, and Decatur, IN. He resigned the pastorate at Decatur to accept the appointment as Administrative Assistant for the Washington (D.C.) District of the Church of the Nazarene, moving to Baltimore, Maryland. He retired in June 1989 and moved to Ocala, Florida and then moved to Bowling Green, KY in 2002.

In 1950, he became a Naturalized United States Citizen in Henry County, IN.

He is the father of two sons, Donald K. Ault Jr. and wife Nancy, of Port Austin, MI and Douglas K. Ault and wife Patricia of Bowling Green, KY; five grandchildren, Lisa A. and husband Erik Andreson, Robert K. and wife Katie Ault, Erin E. and husband Jason Gross, Aimee J. and husband Mark Scott, Alexia R.
