Jesus Film Partnerships - to Entertain or Convict?

Amos Anteg, Philippines JFP Director, sent this report following his trip in May to the southern islands. You can see the value in kingdom building to support JFP Partnerships.

"Last year, of 11,186 viewers, 5,260 people said YES to Jesus, 129 cell groups formed, and 18 new churches were established. Lourdes, my wife, accompanied me to Mindanao to see the progress of ministry. Here are some of the places we stopped.

"In Lanao Del Norte, we met with pastor Reynante Noynay where they average 25. They purchased a lot and house for a place of worship. In North Cotabato, we visited the

new Wesleyan Church in Lebak. Their DS is negotiating to purchase a new property we claimed in prayer.

"In Sultan Kudarat, the people meet in a house church and are praying to complete the funds this month to purchase land and build a church.

"In South Cotabato, we reached Kalupingen WC planted by JFP. The people waited all day for our arrival. Mr. & Mrs. Cornelio Cabrido, faithful laymen and members from Kulaman WC – the mother church that sponsored the



showing in the area, are now working full time in the new church.

"We met Mr. Dominador Noces, a former Civilian Armed Forces sniper who's "god" was his gun. He pursued his targets without fear. Last year, a JFP team came to his village and he attended the crusade and received Christ as his Savior. He continues to grow in faith and gives his testimony of conversion without shame to his former comrades. As a gesture of his love for Christ and for the ministry, he donated the church lot where the church building now stands. I talked personally with him and thanked him for what he has done."

In 1960, she went to Puerto Rico to be Principal of Wesleyan Academy and continued there for over two decades. In 1981, she retired to part time teaching for another 15 years. In 1996, Roberta ended her overseas ministry and lived in Wesleyan Village in Brooksville, Florida. She was very active in Village life.

Roberta observed her 92nd birthday April 28th and passed away the next day. Her funeral was held in the Brooksville Wesleyan Church with burial in the Brooksville Cemetery adjacent to the church.

The facility has transitioned to a referral and teaching center.

Presently over a dozen student nurses, midwives, and community health officers are visiting and working at the hospital. A new pediatric ward has expanded both pediatrics and obstetrics. The new hospital Jesus Film ministry has brought a large increase in new believers. Ruth continues her ministry to youth and Ladies Bible study on the back veranda. Praise the Lord for His faithfulness in answering so many prayers for the church in its various ministries, and for a break in Ruth's chemotherapy that has allowed this return visit.

Czech Republic – The Influence of Communism



The mantra of communism - "There is no God" - invariably took its toll on this nation that once was a part of a profound spiritual revival in Europe (John Huss). "The Czech Republic, along with Estonia, the Nordic countries, France and the Netherlands, has one of the least religious populations in the world. Historically, Czech the people have been characterized as tolerant and even indifferent towards religion" states author, Richard Felix Staar, in Communist Regimes in Eastern Europe (Issue 269, p. 90). The majority of Czechs are agnostic or atheist; with less than 1% as engaged Christ followers. THIS is why we are here.

More than half our staff serves in Brno and ministers through English classes and English Conversation Clubs, supporting our local church, and hosting community events at the Majak Ministry Center. In addition to building personal relationships within our community setting, we have opportunities to share Christ at yearly summer EuroCamps (photo), and by giving leadership to an international church body. Currently church plant preparations are underway in Prague (the capital city) and also in the smaller nearby town of Podebrady. Lives are being touched and changed for Christ! We are thrilled to see more church leaders emerging in Brno and anticipate wonderful things with the new plants.
