Missionary Prayer Focus

One of the greatest ways to actively be involved in what God is doing across the nations is by praying. Global Partners (GP) is asking for focused prayer this week for **our Asia-Pacific Missionaries**.



Global Partners has over 20 families and individuals who live, work and share the gospel around several Asia-Pacific countries.

Here is what God is doing in some of those areas:

Cambodia: The Wesleyan Church in Cambodia celebrated 30 years in 2025! God is producing a harvest of workers who are eager to share the hope of Jesus with their family and friends. They started out with just two pastors, and now there are nine Wesleyan pastors and six congregations around Cambodia. Praise the Lord!

Japan: Japan is still a highly unreached area. Although there are well established churches, there is a great need for younger believers to step into pastoral roles and shepherd the active churches. Drawbridge Creations is continuing to reach a lot of people and change lives. Please pray that the ongoing manga project Waypoints will reach a wider audience and that God will use these stories to open people's hearts to the Gospel.

South Asia: The gospel is becoming harder to share as the government is continually putting pressure to minimize the spread of Jesus. Despite the hardships, local pastors are continuing to pursue the lost and connect with locals.

- **Pray** for perseverance and for more hearts to know Jesus in Cambodia.
- **Pray** for more young believers to step into ministry and for churches in Japan to continually share the gospel with boldness.
